




7th Annual Saucon Valley History Day



Speaker Series Review: Local Railroads History




Our Speaker Series continued with its third installment on June 5th; Dale Woodland entertained us with his knowledge of the Reading Railroad. Dale is an author of several books about the Reading Line, and currently serves as the Director of Museum Operations at the Reading Railroad Heritage Museum in Hamburg, PA.

Dale began his fascination with trains when he was four, when he rode on the Reading to Philadelphia train from Norristown. His love of the Reading Railroad continued to grow, and throughout the years he took many photos of special trains on the line, collecting photos of the many types of trains that traveled

the tracks. All of this was put into a PowerPoint presentation highlighting old stations, train wrecks, and photos from the Hellertown area. Dale interspersed the photos with historical facts about the Reading line.

The Bethlehem Branch was originally constructed by the North Pennsylvania Railroad, and was often referred to as the "North Penn". Dale noted how this line had a very steep grade, which sometimes led to delays and the need for extra engines to haul heavy loads. We learned that the old roundtable from the end of the Bethlehem line had been rescued, and is stored at the Reading Heritage Museum.

Dale's presentation was complimented by some of our own artifacts that were saved from the Hellertown Railroad Station. Richard Kantor and Craig Bartholomew searched through the station and found gems such as telegraphs from the 1870's and waybills. We had some of these amazing items on display, and they can still be viewed during regular museum hours.
