

We are entering into our busy spring season of activities which are covered in this newsletter. We hope to see you at History Day, Shopping at the Mill, and upcoming Speakers' Nights. A very special fundraiser is planned for Sunday, October 6, 2013. We will celebrate National German American Day, a day declared by President Ronald Reagan in 1983, to honor Americans of German heritage. These thirteen families went on to settle Germantown north of Philadelphia. Since the Hellers and the Wagners, as well as many of Hellertown's early families, were German, this will be a day to honor and celebrate their German heritage with a Craft Show, Yard Sale, Tours, Speakers, Live German musical and dance performances, and, of course, lots of delicious German foods. The second night in our Speakers' Series is almost here... Tuesday, May 2nd at 7:00 p.m., featuring our very own Kristen Mills! Kristen will be presenting "Bethlehem's Moravians "in our Tavern Room.

Kristen is a graduate of Saucon Valley High School and holds a
Bachelor's degree with honors in history from Indiana University of
Pennsylvania. She also has a Master's in Museum Studies from Johns
Hopkins University. Later this year she will begin a second master's in
London at the University of Westminster.

What Kristen brings to the evening's presentation is a very insightful view of the Moravians. She was baptized and confirmed at Mountainview Moravian Church in Hellertown. From there she became their youngest ever Elder on the Board of Elders. Her honors thesis, Pietistic Religions and the American Revolution: A Case Study on the Moravian Community of Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, and her work as Site Coordinator of the Moravian Museum of Bethlehem give her in-depth knowledge on this topic. Additionally, she is employed by Historic Bethlehem Museum and Sites.

We hope you will come out and join us for our presentation so we may get to know our neighbors in Bethlehem, the Moravians, better. Free for all Hellertown Historical Society Members and \$5.00 for non members. Tours of the Grist Mill begin at 6:30. Please join us!

DO YOU REMEMBER WHEN??

Do you remember when......Saucon Creek backed up with ice?
A. Jan. 1983 B. Feb. 1984 C. 1985 D. Mar. 1986

Albert Hoffert stopped by the Society's office recently and shared some interesting history about Saucon Creek including a notebook full of newspaper articles, correspondence, pictures, and documents relevant to our beloved Hellertown treasure, the Saucon Creek. Here is the timeline excerpted from his notebook:

1948 New Jersey Zinc Company reopens mine

1951 Wells and springs in the area begin to go dry

1952 At a public meeting at Lehigh County Community College, New Jersey Zinc denies their mining is causing low water levels

1953 New Jersey Zinc furnishes 500 gallon galvanized tanks, shallow

well pump & free water to people whose wells went dry

1971 Account in Bethlehem Globe Times reports water downstream from mine contained 682 times more cadmium, 423 times more zinc & 43 times more calcium than upstream for the mine

1972 Fish kills in Saucon Creek were caused by ack of food due to silt in the stream

Maximum mine depth was 3800 feet & pumping 24 to 30 million gallons per day

Oct. 15, 1983 Pumps were stopped & by 2:00 PM, water level in Saucon
Creek was so low that the Bethlehem Steel had to stop the pump
that furnished water to the coke works

1983 A geologist stated the Saucon might never return to normal

Nov. 15, 1983 Water had risen to 2200 feet from surface

Feb. 8, 1984 Water began flowing from the mine shaft

Mar. 20, 1984 All springs from Meadow Rd. to High St. were flowing at pre-mining rates

And of interest to our fishermen: From 1984 to 2000, Hellertown Sportsman's Association stocked 19,600 4" Brown Trout in Saucon Creek. How many of these were caught this trout season?

Al Groegler named a "Chevalier" of the Legion of Honor

French-American unity was celebrated at the Embassy of France in Washington, DC on February 13, 2013, when WWII veterans were decorated with France's Legion of Honor, as a sign of France's gratitude for their personal contribution to the liberation of France during WWII. Al Groegler was one of twenty veterans, of whom 14 were present, who was awarded their medals in a ceremony officiated by Washington's Consul General of France, Olivier Sérot Almeras, and the Deputy Military Attaché for the French Army, Col. Jacques Aragonès.

During the ceremony, Mr. Sérot Almeras and Col. Aragonès emphasized the sacrifices that were made during WWII for French liberty.

Al has been a volunteer with the Society for the past 30 years. Among other things, he participated in the restoration of the Mill and the Pony Bridge.


