Something Old and Something New-Train Display and Visits with Santa

The flyer for upcoming 2012 holiday events at HHS declared, "The Trains Are Back!" and "Visits with Santa". After a respite of almost a decade, members William Frey and Fran Hudock set up the 144 sq. ft. model train display in the basement of the Miller's House. The display included some vintage buildings over 100 years old and two of Roger Shaffer's incredible handmade scale models-Hellertown's Reading Train Station and Hellertown's Masonic Lodge. It is estimated over 400 hundred folks of all ages visited the trains and magical miniature village and farm scene. Chief Engineer Bill Frey manned most of the weekend hours between Thanksgiving and Christmas with assistance from Fran Hudock and Dick Eckert. Comments from the younger visitors included: "It was Awesome!" "I liked it all." "I like the train with the candy canes best." Numerous requests for the train display to return again in 2013 will be honored. Several new members are eager to help expand and enhance the display for 2013. Thank you Bill, Fran, and Dick, as well as everyone who helped spread the word.

Santa and his Sleigh visited the Mill on Sunday, December 16, 2012. With "elf help" from Cadette Girl Scout Troop 8030 and a cadre of Society members, Santa's visits with over 70 children, several adults, and one photogenic puppy were photographed. Scouts escorted visitors to the Train Display and back again to The Tavern Room for light refreshments. Smiles were the order of the day; it was impossible to find anyone NOT smiling. Our visitors have already expressed hope that "Santa and His Sleigh" will return again next Christmas.

It was a busy holiday season for the Society; just over 900 people visited our site between Thanksgiving and the end of December. Many of these folks had never been inside our buildings before. More than once, we heard, "I never knew all this was here." In addition to the activities, several people stopped to visit after noticing all the holiday decorations and activity. These visits resulted in several bookings for Tavern Room events and also new members.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT DIANNE BOROVIES

When the nominating committee approached me about serving as President, I took several days for thoughtful consideration and conversations with active members before I accepted their nomination. Some members may say, "Who is she?" My husband and I were born and raised here. My maiden name was Cope, and I graduated with my high school sweetheart and now husband, John, from Hellertown Lower Saucon High School. While John went off to Penn State, I went off to nursing school and became an RN. John served in the Army and later became an economist for the USDA in Washington, DC. As a "trailing spouse", I attended four universities and completed undergraduate and graduate degrees and certifications in nursing administration and real estate.

Wherever I travelled and lived, when asked where my hometown was, I always responded, "Hellertown, PA." My interest in history began at Reinhard School, and by adulthood, I was an avid history buff. I particularly enjoyed studying the history of the Heller family, the Pennsylvania Germans, the Lutherans, and the Moravians.

After retiring from careers in nursing administration and teaching as well as owning my own business, a real estate brokerage firm in Virginia, I was delighted to return to our hometown and the farm where my husband was raised. I am now able to pursue my love of local history on a full time volunteer basis. Our two sons are both active duty military-the elder a Marine officer and the younger a Naval officer. But, enough with the personal history.

Today, the members of our organization, Hellertown Historical Society (HHS), are committed to carrying on the work of past members. We are challenged by several current demographic, economic, and legislative issues. A thoughtful study of our membership reveals we are losing members. This might be attributed to aging of the population, to the economic times, or to other issues. The cost of maintaining our buildings and grounds is increasing. Our Trust Fund has decreased in amount due to increased costs of maintenance and repairs in recent years. To say our budget is tight is an understatement.

Pennsylvania Legislation regarding Small Games of Chance (SGOC), Act 2 and Act 184 of 2012, has a major impact on how our organization conducts fundraising. After an in depth review and discussion of these laws and attendance at a state conducted seminar on the topic, HHS Board of Directors has made the decision to carry on only legal means of fundraising and those which require no background checks, no



special licenses, and, most important, no extensive weekly record keeping and future reporting to the PA Department of Revenue. Our volunteer manpower simply does not allow for this. What does this mean? It means the 2012 Monte Carlo Night, the 2012 Raffle, 2012 50:50's, and the Summer and Winter Lotteries of 2012 were the Society's final SGOC. Your Board of Directors and a Fundraising Committee are hard at work exploring new initiatives to raise funds to carry out the Society's mission. We welcome ideas from all members. Watch for updates in future newsletters.

After much discussion, the Board of Directors unanimously approved a **new dues structure for 2013**, which includes modest increases in dues as well as specific benefits for members. Benefits include discounts on purchases of gift shop items, free Speakers' Nights, a new Annual Membership Meeting, and a complimentary meal at Spring Spruce up Day. Business and Lifetime Members also receive special donation rates for annual use of our Tavern Room. All members are welcome at all meetings and events and will continue to receive quarterly newsletters. The possibility of offering an email version of the newsletter in the future is under consideration. With this in mind, we are beginning to collect members' email addresses.

We have recently updated our mission statement and are thoughtfully developing a vision statement for our organization. Your officers have been reaching out to members to seek ideas and input into what you wish to see our organization pursue in upcoming years. I encourage you to share your ideas for the future and also to become actively involved as your time will allow. Our needs are many, and many hands do make light work. There are opportunities for small projects you may work on at home, as well as committee work, or work on site. The year 2014 will be the thirtieth anniversary year for HHS. Thank you in advance for your continued support and help in preserving Hellertown's history and heritage.

Pony Bridge Reopened with Ribbon Cutting



The official ribbon cutting ceremony the afternoon of Sunday, November 18, 2012, was highlighted by the announcement of David Heintzelman as the local businessman whose generous donation allowed the Society to purchase materials and hire a contractor to assist members and community volunteers with the 2012 repairs to the Pony Bridge. The sun was shining as a small crowd gathered at the entrance to the Pony Bridge for the celebratory program. Earl Hill welcomed the guests and offered the sincere thanks of the organization and the community to Mr. Heintzelman. Two additional contributions of contractor Mark Repsher and Sam Donato of IESE were also acknowledged.

Dianne Borovies presented a historical timeline of the Pony Bridge from 1860 to the present. She explained the donated funds facilitated the replacement of rotten red oak flooring and support beams with longer lasting white oak. The event concluded with the official ribbon cutting by Mr.'s Heintzelman and Hill. Guests were then invited to stroll across the newly reopened bridge on their way to a social hour in the Tavern Room. Guests viewed pictures and memorabilia of Pony Bridge history and enjoyed light refreshments. Jan Doddy of Doddy Photography donated his services and recorded the events of the day.
